
5 Minute Phonics

Phonics Warmup ideas.





Builds foundational skills:

Teaches the relationship between sounds and letters, helping learners encode and decode words.

Facilitates long-term retention:

By focusing on sound patterns, learners are more likely to retain vocabulary and reading skills.

Promotes language independence:


 Learners gain the skills to read and understand new words without relying on memorization.

- Enhances reading ability
- Supports spelling accuracy
 - Encourages phonemic awareness
 - Bridges gaps between written and spoken English
 - Boosts overall literacy
 - Adaptable to different






CVC Letter Bank
Version




Telephone

Human Typewriter

- Split the class into teams of around 10.
- Each team is assigned a letter A-Z (Usually go down each line).
- Say a CVC word.
- First member of each team to have each correct member stood up wins.



Human Typewriter

Tips and Variations:

- Write letters on top post-its or make flashcards. Have students hold them up.
- Add in more complex phonics sounds.
- Assign each team a different word.
