


# Using these resources to your advantage

# In Class Games



### Battleship

- Draw 10 circles on the upper part of the game board.
- Kids ask yes/no questions and fill in lower half using Xs and Os based on answers.
- The goal is to find all 10 of your partners circles.







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### Sugoroku

- Regular board game made to target English grammar.
- Super flexible and can easily be changed.
- Kids will take turns rolling dice and practicing the target grammar that their playing piece stops on.










### Heads up 7 up

- Fun game to introduce new vocabulary and very simple sentences.
- 7 students will be selected as "it" and hold vocabulary pictures and stand at the front of the room.
- Everyone else puts their heads down and the 7 students will select 7 other students. When done everyone will open their eyes.
- The students will have to guess who picked them when their head was down.
- This is where you can introduce grammar or only the words.






### Heads up


- Requires pre-made cards.
- Can target vocabulary and small grammar points.
- Students make pairs and hold the card to their forehead and their partner will have to gesture and try to describe the word they have.
- Students will earn a point for each word they get correct.

### Snakes and Lillies

- Board game that has a start and finish and works very much like snakes and ladders.
- The kids use erasers as their playing pieces and dice for rolls.
- They can skip spaces by hopping across lily pads and they have to go back spaces when they land on a snake.
- Can be used for just vocabulary or grammar points.








### Survival Game

- A game the class plays as a whole.
- Generally it is for grammar that you can replace two parts.
- Students write five Os on their board and stand up.
- Every student will read off one sentence and after it has been read everyone will write an X in that square.
- If all your Os have been Xed out sit down.
- The students standing with a 0 left in the last square that has not been read, win.



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


### Categories

- Game that requires little prep.
- Categories will be written on the board (colors, animals, etc.)
- Students make groups and will write words based on that category for a set time.
- Students share the words after and cross out words that other groups have.
- The team with the most unique words win.



### Last one Standing


- Played like Karuta, students can use textbook cards or ones made by the ALT.
- Students will pick 4 cards and stand up.
- ALT will read off cards, if their cards are called the student puts it down.
- If all their cards are read they sit down.
- The goal is to be the last to sit after all the cards have been read.
- Rules are also flexible and can be changed to who can get all their cards called first.
