



Tips to Create an Effective High School Lesson Plan

1. Know your students

- what level of English are they at
- what are their interests



K-POP



- Can they answer in complete sentences or complex sentences?

Tips to Create an Effective High School Lesson Plan

2. Teach language in context: Move away from isolated grammar drills to real life communication and deeper thinking.



- **Roleplays**
- **Discussions**
- **Partner Talk**
- **Debates**

Tips to Create an Effective High School Lesson Plan

3. Focusing on All Four Skills: Integrating listening, writing, reading, and SPEAKING.



- **GIVE STUDENTS TIME TO TALK.**
- **Students should be doing at least 70% of the talking!**

Tips to Create an Effective High School Lesson Plan

4. Routine: Using the same **LESSON PLAN** format everytime.



- **Students know what is expected of them.**
- **Less time explaining things.**
- **Easier for you to plan.**







Introduction/Warm up

Introduction/Warm up

- **Warm/anticipatory activity**
 - **Should be exciting, attention grabbing, should introduce the topic of the lesson!**
 - **Games, discussion, listening (pronun pyramid, describe)**
 - **Vocabulary: Heads Up**
- 



Instruction/Model/ Demonstration



Teaching students:

- **introduce a new concept**
- **new vocabulary**
- **new grammar point**

★ **Shouldn't take up more than 20% of your class time**


★ **Everytime you ask your students to do something you should be modeling it for them!**





Activity/Guided Practice


- **What will students do to practice?**
 - ★ **Speaking, writing, listening, comparing with a partner/group/class**
 - ★ **Importance of making mistakes**

Main Activity/Guided Practice







- Full class debate



